Maclay School is is a PK-12 independent, non-sectarian college preparatory school. We are dedicated to providing a *liberal arts* education, enabling each student to develop the inherent ability to the fullest extent with a *balance* of discipline and freedom. A group of parents founded the school in 1968 naming it in memory of Alfred B. Maclay, Jr., a World War II veteran whose mother was a major benefactor. The 2020-21 school year is the 53rd year for Maclay, now under the leadership of James Milford who is in his seventh year as Head of School.

Community

Maclay School is located in the state capital, Tallahassee, Florida. The city of Tallahassee and surrounding area of Leon Country is home to 293,582 residents as of 2019. As well as being the seat of state government, Tallahassee supports three major institutions of higher learning: Florida A&M University, Florida State University, and Tallahassee Community College. Tallahassee is home to the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory.

Student Body
