and safer classrooms, additional study areas, a school store, and new homes for the Upper School administration as well as our College Counseling office. The building was designed to host Lower and Middle School events and shift the epicenter of campus as a new hub of activity.

This project would never have been possible without years of dedicated faculty building a program that warranted a home worthy of their work, the leadership of the Board of Trustees and their vision to ensure the School continues to be a leader in our region, and the generosity of our donors who all gave sacrificially to impact your children and our shared future. We will work over the next month to have all students take part in the expanded space because it is theirs.
