

2021 Counselor Apprentice (Volunteer)

Purpose: These positions are seasonal volunteers under the supervision of the Camp Director. The main responsibility of these positions is to lead a group of campers in having an enjoyable, safe, and enriching camp experience.

Responsibilities:

- Take responsibility for the health, well-being, and happiness of campers
- Provide opportunities for the group so that all individuals experience success while at camp
- Encourage respect for other campers, personal property, camp equipment and facilities
- Guide campers in participating successfully in all aspects of camp activities
- Assist counselors and instructors, and actively participate in all aspects of the campers' day
- Communicate regularly with counselors regarding concerns, updates, challenges
- Maintain positive relationships with campers by showing sensitivity to campers' emotional needs and problem solving any camper issues effectively
- Be a role model for campers by following all policies and demonstrating enthusiasm, sense of humor, and selfcontrol
- Implement positive behavior-management techniques
- Help maintain space and supplies

Qualifications:

- Demonstrated experience working with children; camp or other group experience preferred
- Ability to teach and lead various recreational activities
- Excellent character, integrity, and adaptability
- Ability to communicate and work with a variety of age and skill levels
- The desire and ability to work in a cooperative, team-oriented atmosphere
- Enthusiasm, sense of humor, patience, and self-control
- Minimum age/grade ~ entering 9th grade

General:

- Demonstrates and enthusiastically supports the School's Mission and values of being honorable, respectful and accountable
- Expected to be of a maturity that shows a definitive gap between the role of a camper and those who are caregivers for them. Being an apprentice holds the responsibility to aid staff with the best interest of the camper's safety, security, well-being, and enjoyment in mind. Any disruption to the daily responsibilities of providing service for our campers may result in dismissal from the volunteer program.
- Continually display outstanding traits of character and integrity. All apprentices are asked to approach camp in the same behavioral expectations of being a student of the school under the Maclay Honor Code. Any apprentice who chooses to disregard the school's standards of character can expect dismissal from the apprentice program.

Physical Requirements and Work Environment:

- Works in a noisy, fast paced environment both indoors and outdoors.
- Be able to occasionally lift 45 lbs.
- Work intermittently in outside weather conditions which include daily exposure to sun, heat, water and bugs.
- Must be able to assist campers in an emergency (fire, evacuation, illness, or injury)
- Must possess strength and endurance required to maintain constant supervision of campers.
- Prolonged standing, some bending, and walking required
- Cell phone use is not permitted during working hours
